WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

1. SELF HELP GROUP

Established 715 women's self help groups in 300 rural villages in 6 blocks (Kaij, Ambajogai, Majalgaon, Beed Dharur, Wadwani) in Beed district in Maharashtra. Each self help group has an average of 10 to 15 women member including Dalit, Adivasi, ST, OBC, Poor, Open and a total of 8140 women have been linked to these 715 self help groups.

The bank account of this women's self-help group was opened in bank. Through monthly meetings, women were trained on the importance of self-help groups, women self-employment, group record writing and various government schemes for self-help groups. The women were also given guidance on women's health, violence against women, laws related to women, gender equality through meetings from time to time.

A total of 8580 meetings of 715 self help groups were held at village level in 300 villages. Women capacity was built from that meeting.



2. Women Counseling Center



A women's counseling center is run in the premises of the police station at Kaij and Dharur blocks in Beed district. Four trained staff of MSW education work as counselors in this counseling center. Through this counseling center, 1029 destitute and helpless women are helped through 4 ways.

After the victim came to the counseling center, the counselor took her statement into account and understood what kind of help she needed. These women were helped as follows.

1. Counseling

Firstly counselors carefully listen women issues and problems. 99% of women live with their father's house as homeless laborers after being abandoned by their husband. These women live with their children in the age group of one to 15 years. At this time, with the help of the police station, a notice is issued to her husband (defendant). Both are given dates of their convenience for counseling.

On the day of the counseling, both of them were consulted on minor issues such as suspicion, mobile chatting, male drinking addiction, sexual harassment, misunderstandings and similar issues. Misunderstandings and arguments between them are cleared.

Now both of them happily started living together by doing legal writing documents. Through the counseling of 288 women came back to her husband life and house. And it is regularly followed by the organization and village level self help group.

Health Support

A woman who has been beaten by her husband or in-law from family. Health facilities were immediately made available to the women who were injured due to the beating. A total of 89 women received health care during these years.

Legal Support

The victim's women husband and her in-laws were called for counseling. However, the woman was taken to her husband's house, which her in-laws were not ready. Or if the woman goes to her mother-in-law house, the woman may be in danger situation. So Free legal aid was provided to 185 such women and gives them justice.



Self Employment

The victimized women have no any support of income and no any livelihood option available. These 157 women self employment like flour mill, goat rearing, cow rearing, poultry rearing and sale of leafy vegetable at village level.

Govt. Scheme

Under Sanjay Gandhi and Indira Gandhi Niradhar Yojana, government pension and free ration of Rs.1000 per month was provided to 349 women.

A total of 1068 women victims and destitute were assisted through counseling center.

3. Women Training



A two-day 71 capacity building training program for 3575 women (5 leading women per Self help group) from 715 Self help groups in 6 block was conducted at the block level. These women gave training on following subject,

A total of 3575 women were trained through training.

Result

At the village level, women in the Self Help group were empowered to prevent violence against women.

The savings group was able to keep the group's records up to date and regular meetings has began.

1680 women benefited from various government schemes. It also linked 218 savings groups to the bank.

Women are using masks, sanitizers, hand washes, social distancing. Also both the doses of Covid-19 prevention have been taken by women and they have injected both these preventive doses of their family members.

192 small self-employment of women at the village level has been created and the livelihood of them and their families has been enabled.

Sugarcane cutter worker women aware in terms of their own health and the care taken about health.

Agriculture Development

1. Dal Mill for Farmers



In rural areas, farmers grow tur, moong, urad and Harbhara in their farms. Big Shopkeepers in the market buy these grains from farmers at low prices. Then these shopkeepers make pulses of grains in large Dal mills in the city. The same Dal is again sold to farmers and people in rural areas for a very high amount of money.

Reenaji Nanda considered need of these poor and needy farmers and made available a good Dal mill. Through this Dal mill, 247 farmers made pulses from farm grain on the basis of neither profit nor loss. It was the local farmers who ran this Dal mill which gave permanent employment to the five women farmers.

2. Farmers Training

A Two day's Six trainings were conducted in collaboration with NTPC for 100 NTPC affected farmers of Solapur district. In this, on the first day, the farmers were given training on Farming, MGNRGA, organic farming, marketing through theoretical. Also, the next day, all these farmers were shown a demonstration about the best quality organic Khad (Shivansh Khad) produced in 18 days.



Result: The trained farmers created demos of organic farming in their own fields after training. Using this fertilizer, they are growing different types of fruits, flowers, vegetables in the field. Fruits, flowers and vegetables produced on organic farming are being sold in the local market (Solapur market) at double the price. This is benefiting farmers from their farms.

COVID-19 relief Work

1. Groceries Kit Help

During the COVID-19 situation, groceries sufficient for one month were distributed to 960 families who had death due to COVID-19, poor, needy, destitute, deserted, elderly, disabled, dalit, and suicidal farmer family. This satisfied the hunger of the entire family for food grains in these difficult COVID-19 situation.

The Janvikas Samajik Sanstha itself went to grocery stores and purchase grocery kits. Also purchased wheat, jowar and pulses from the farmers at the right price. This also benefited the farmers.

2. Reliance Foundation Supported Help

1200 Poor, needy, destitute, deserted, elderly, dalit, COVID-19 death affected and suicidal farmer families were given a month-long grocery food kit. This support given by Reliance Foundation towards Janvikas Samajik Sanstha for distribution.

Food kits of groceries were distributed directly to the beneficiaries by selecting the poor and needy beneficiaries. This support had very much satisfied the family's for a month.



3. Habitat for humanity India

250 families who have lost their lives due to CORONA, Suicidal farmers, poor, needy, destitute, deserted were given food kits of groceries which is sufficient for one month from Habitat for Humanity India towards Janvikas Samajik Sanstha.

Food kits of groceries were distributed directly to the beneficiaries by selecting the poor and needy beneficiaries. This stopped the hunger of these people and families.



4. N-95 Mask, Sanitizer and hand wash Support

N-95 masks, sanitizers and hand washes were distributed to 5000 people such as poor, needy, sanitation workers, Safai karmachari, police department, government employees, doctors, nurses, government administration, Nagar panchayat employees, court departments, lawyers, journalists, front and workers, social workers, women during the corona period as well as in the lockdown. Due to which all these people got a huge support to go and work among the people in the bad times of Corona. Also, PPE kits and health materials were distributed to 200 doctors treating corona patients.



5. Cash Support

As per the number of family members, the 340 family was provided assistance of Rs. 3,000 to Rs. 10,000 per family depending on their needs to purchase vegetables, milk, gas, clothes and health items. As a result, his family's financial needs were fulfill with this money.



6. Linked to Govt. Scheme

These families were linked to the Maharashtra Govt. PDS scheme, so they are now getting 2 kg of wheat at the rate of Rs. 2 per month and 3 kg of wheat at the rate of Rs. 3 per month.

These families were linked to Sanjay Gandhi Niradhar Yojana & Indira Gandhi Niradhar Yojana govt. scheme. These families were started to getting a pension of Rs. 1000 per month. For all these govt. Process Hon. Deputy Collector, Ambajogai and Hon. Block Tehsildar, Kaij helped a lot.



6. Awareness About COVID-19

Awareness was done among the people regarding social distancing, using mask, sanitizers etc in COVID-19 situation. Also distributed masks and sanitizers to the people and made them use these compulsory. Vaccination was done by creating awareness in the people to get everyone vaccinated.



Self Employment



Due to the death of a main family member of a poor family in the corona period, his children, women and elderly parents in his family became unemployed. They had no means of income and livelihood source available.

Therefore, a survey of 500 families who die due to CORONA and committed suicide due infertility was conducted. And their needs and skills were studied and surveyed. According to their needs, they were provided following livelihood option.

A total of 165 families were self-employed and their livelihood was enabled. They had got permanent source of livelihood and survival.

- 100 families were start rearing goats business.

Goat Rearing

Flour Mill

- 15 families were given flour mill. Through this, their self-employment at the village level was created.

- 100 acres of land belonging to 50 families was repaired and made cultivable.

Land Development

Background of sudden Flood:

In Beed district of Maharashtra, it has been raining continuously since September 15, 2021. However, between September 25 and 30, there was heavy rain and cloudburst. As a result, many small nallas, streams, rivers and lakes in Beed district were flooded. Meanwhile, rivers, lakes and dams exceeded the danger level. Some small dams burst. Sudden floods at night and rivers, lakes, and dam water flooded in villages. As it was night time, water flooded the houses of many villagers.

So people left home with their children and rushed to other places to save their lives. About 100 villages in the area were flooded.



Effect on flood affected peoples and livestock's



Thousands of animals, such as cows, buffaloes, ox, goats, and hens, were swept away in the floodwaters at night. Many animals died on the spot. Many farmers and laborer families depended on this animal for their livelihood. Also, when the house of the poor was in water, the food grains in the house got wet and totally destroyed, the clothes in the house got wet and even flooded in water. The stone, mud house of the poor fell in water.

Roads, bridge of the village were carried away. The light transformer electric pole fell in villages water. Many villages lost their contact. Kharif crop in the field in which soybean, tur, hybrid, Jwar, mug, urad, bajra were all flooded in water. Agriculture crop totally in flooded. People trapped in the floodwaters were evacuated by boat and by helicopter. All this took place at a distance of 5 km from Janvikas Training Center and in the area of Janvikas. My own village was flooded.

The police administration, social workers, as well as the village gram panchayat and the youth council worked hard day and night to save the people from the floods and move them to safer places.

Immediately Help from Janvikas

All the Janvikas staff reached out to the people in the villages. staff also went to the village and meet the people and sent them to a safe place from water. Also worked to rescue those trapped in the floods. Janvikas started the co-operation needed by the administration to get people out of the flood. Janvikas arranged accommodation and meals for 140 flood affected people and their children at the Janvikas Training Center.

Valuable support from Donors

Janvikas immediately discussed the situation with individual donors and friend circle and sent a letter of request to immediate help for these peoples. We are thanks individual donors and friend circle for immediate valuable and great support for these flood affected peoples. Janvikas team and the entire flood affected people are thankful for providing immediate assistance to the flood victims.

Community Kitchen

A community kitchen meal was arranged in front of the Samaj Mandir at the village level in flood affected 4 villages namely Isthali, Naygaon, Ghodekhur and Vida in Kaij block of Beed district. meal planning committee were established in these 4 villages. The Sarpanch of the village Gram Panchayat, Yuvak Mandal, women participated in this committee.

The menu consisted chapati, rice, varan, one dry vegetable and sweet shira. In all these four villages, required groceries kept in the Samaj Mandir. In one village, 20 volunteer people were cooking at one time, in which women, youth and villagers participated. Twice in the morning and evening, 40 people were voluntarily cooking and eating together these meals.

The concept of community kitchen was liked all villagers and the control over it remained with all the villagers. Therefore, in 4 flood affected villages like Isthali, Naygaon, Ghodekhur and Vida 800 to 900 people ate twice a day. Community Kitchen ran for 15 days from 1st October 21 to 15th October 21 in 4 villages. So the problem of survival of the people was solved and the people of the village did not go hungry.



Tent shelter

We met immediately the extremely poor and needy people whose houses have been flooded by water. 250 Families in 4 villages were provided with 12 X 18 size plastic tarpaulins and wood for erection of tents. Therefore, an emergency shelter for these 250 families could be set up in a safe place at the village level. Therefore, 5 persons per family, 250 x 5 = 750 people were sheltered through this tent shelter. The family was safe through the tent during the flood crisis.



Blanket Help

In a situation where the family has nothing to cover any Blankets, chadar at a sleep time. The 250 families to whom we have set up tent shelters were assisted with blankets and Chadars. Therefore, arrangements were made to cover the family with shelter. As mentioned above, thanks to your valuable support and cooperation, 1100 flood affected families were provided with food, shelter and blankets. Thank you very much for this immediate and great support.
