Since 1995,the organization is striving for the rights of the vulnerable and weaker sections of the society with focus on their development and ownership.

VISION

Self dependent society with equal and just opportunities, access to natural resources, people in their own governance with life of dignity and respect.

MISSION

Socio-economic, educational up-lift-ment of Dalit, NT/DNT, Landless, labors, Farmers, Women, Children, Disables, Tribal, Sugarcane cutter, Victims in disaster and all the invisible, poor and vulnerable groups of the society residing mainly in rural areas.

Target Area:

Janvikas Samajik Sanstha has been working since 1995 for the overall development of women, children, farming, farmers, farm laborers, and education in economically, socially and educationally backward 350 rural areas villages from 7 blocks of Beed district, Murud, Janjira and Karjat block from Raigad district of Maharashtra and villages form Silvasa.

Women Empowerment

1. Women Self Help Group:

In the Beed district of Maharashtra, the organization has established 172 new women's savings groups in the rural areas, including small hamlets, settlements, and colonies, along with the marginalized communities. Each savings group consists of 11 to 13 women members who belong to economically disadvantaged, needy, abandoned, destitute, and wido wed backgrounds.



They are freed from the burden of higher interest rates and harassment by local moneylenders or other individuals. Additionally, proper records of savings group meetings are maintained on a regular basis.

2. Bank Linkages

Bank proposals are prepared for women savings groups that are facing financial difficulties or those who wish to establish their own small selfemployment ventures. These proposals are submitted to the bank, and the women are provided with the facility of loans through the bank. In the current year, proposals for bank linkages have been prepared for a total of 146 savings groups. 1123 women have established small self-employment ventures through this initiative.



A total of 973 women have benefited from bank linkages through this organized loan repayment system.

3. Counseling Center

In collaboration with the State Women's Commission, the Women Guidance Center, a part of the police station at the taluka level, is operated to provide assistance to distressed, destitute, and vulnerable women in the Beed district. When a complaint is received from an affected woman, immediate assistance is provided to her. Two staff



members work full-time at this center, who are MSW qualified and are capable of handling such cases.

Drinking Water

Ensure safe, clean and sustainable drinking water supply to poor and marginalized communities in Three highly drought prone Hamlet of Vida Gram Panchayat of Beed district in Maharashtra. The project duration is 3 years and so far following results have been achieved in 5 months.

1. Public drinking water wells (42 X 50 size) have been completed in two villages.

2. Pipelines supplying drinking water from wells to public drinking water tanks were completed in two villages.

3. Construction of 50000 liter water storage tank for drinking water was completed in a One village.

4. A bore-well and a tank with a capacity of 3000 water storage were constructed in a One village. Through this, 100 families of this village were provided with drinking water permanently.

5. 500 animals were provided drinking water through 1000 liter water storage capacity tank.

<u>Livelihood</u>

Sustainable livelihood development for 100 women through goat from low-income families in murud block of Raigad Goat rearing business of 100 tribal and poor women started. Each goat produced 2 to 3 kids during the project period. On an average, each woman earned an income of Rs 40,000 to 50,000 from the sale of goat kids. (100 women earned an average of Rs 40 to 50 lakhs in a year. Their family and children are currently getting goat's milk. Through this, the financial situation of this family improved.



Sanitation

Construction of individual household latrines for 25 families in sayali village of silvassa dadra & nagar haveli. Toilets were constructed for 25 poor and tribal families who did not have toilets. This family's access to open toilets was permanently stopped. Currently this family is using this toilet. This helped improve the health of the family. Due to our project Sayli village was declared as Open Defecation Free (ODF).





Education

Up gradation of residential facility for the blind in kharadpada in naroli in dadra and nagar haveli. Residential schools for visually challenged children were renovated. Living facility for 25 visually challenged children were renovated. Improved physical environment can potentially enhance the motivation and engagement of visually





challenged students in their educational pursuits.

Enhancing water accessibility and establishing a computer lab at ashram school at pathraj village Karjat block Raigad District.

Disater Managment

Emergency relief-support to 5 drought affected villages through installation of bore-well and water tanks in Beed district Maharashtra. Permanent provision of drinking water to people and animals in 5 drought-affected villages. In 5 villages affected by drought, water storage of 30000 liters of drinking water was done permanently through 10 tanks with two tanks of 3000 water storage capacity per village.





<u>Health</u>

Installation of oxygen facility at primary health care center at khodoil district palghar. 40 villages access to oxygen supply in emergency situation. Installation of Oxygen Pipeline System at Primary Health Care Centre, Khodoli; 7 outlets along with 2 oxygen cylinders of 7,000 litres capacity each.
